Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you and your families are well as we approach the end of a very busy and enjoyable half-term. Eckington School reopens again on Monday 6th November 2023.

Since September, there have been many whole school changes designed to improve the quality of education at Eckington School. These changes have included:

- Launching The "Eckington Way" & implementing a new "Ready to Learn" classroom behaviour system
- Introducing an out of lesson Commendation and Correction System •
- Launching a "Star of the Lesson" rewards system •
- Introducing a "Big Question" starter in lessons to improve student engagement and create links to prior learning (sequencing and interleaving pedagogy)

I am pleased to inform you that these changes have already had an impact. Two external reviews (one from Chorus Academy Trust and one from the Department for Education's Behaviour Hubs Programme) have stated that the school climate and student behaviour has noticeably improved.

Behaviour Hubs Update

On 25 October 2023 Eckington School welcomed two external inspectors into the school as part of the Department for Education Behaviour Hubs program. During their visit, they observed the new behaviour policy in action and spoke to students and staff to collect their viewpoints. I am pleased to inform you that the student and staff voice was overwhelmingly positive. During their visit, students stated that, 'Since September, behaviour has improved, the school is safer, and we are learning more in lessons' (Year 10 student panel -DfE Behaviour Hubs 2023)

Further school improvement work is planned throughout the academic year to ensure The Eckington Way is embedded, and standards of behaviour continue to improve, allowing students to make better levels of academic progress in a calm and supporting school climate.

Improving Communication with Parents

New Website Update

Over the next half-term, I am hoping to launch a Parents' Hub on the school's website that should help parents and carers navigate to frequently visited areas of our new website within 3 clicks. Parents and carers will be informed when this goes live.

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New Reporting and Communication System Starting in January 2024

The school will be introducing a new operating system in January 2024 called Arbor. This will be replacing our current system called SIMS. The Eckington Way: New Focus for Half-Term 2



Since September 2023, the school has focused on three of the five Eckington Way core values (A **safe** school, a **calm** school, and a **polite and kind** school). From November, alongside the first 3 Eckington Way core values, we will be focusing on being **prepared**. We will therefore be focusing on:

Attendance and punctuality – arriving to school and lessons on time. Students will be issued with consequences if they are late to school or lessons. Having the correct equipment – all necessary learning materials, including PE kit and a bag large enough to carry all pieces of equipment. Wearing the correct uniform to school. From November 6th, students wearing incorrect uniform will be issued with a double correction in their planner by their form tutor during morning registration.

Mobile Phone Reminder

Mobile phones should be turned off and placed in student bags at all times. If seen, mobile phones will be confiscated until 3pm (the same day). For safeguarding reasons, we have deliberately decided not to ban them from school premises (to ensure students have them on their way to and from school, should parents require it). However, the school accepts no liability if these devices are damaged or lost.

School Closure at 13:20 for Flooding on Friday 20th October 2023

Thank you for your support on Friday 20th October 2023. Within 1 hour of deciding to close the school early, the school ensured all students had the opportunity to eat a hot meal (normally served at 1320). We also made the decision to ensure parents gave their permission for their child to go home (to ensure all of our 1260 students could get home safely in the extreme weather conditions). I would also like to thank EckIngton's staff who helped support this extraordinary situation, including the staff who remained in school until all students could get home safely.

Extreme Weather Procedure

During extreme weather, particularly when heavy snow is forecasted, the school will consult BBC weather, our bus companies, and the school's site manager before making decisions to remain open or close. At the heart of every decision will be student and staff safety.

In common with many other large secondary schools, our staff are drawn from a large area. Therefore, a key factor in any decision about opening in extreme conditions will be whether we can guarantee sufficient staffing to supervise all students safely.

With winter approaching, if a decision is made to either delay opening or close the school completely, parents will be notified via the following:
