Successful Sixth Form Enquiry Visit

In January 2025 we were delighted to host an enquiry visit from Chorus Education Trust's Director of Education. The enquiry visit focused on assessing the quality of teaching and learning within our sixth form provision, and I am pleased to report that the findings were very positive. The feedback highlighted good teaching with excellent subject knowledge, and exemplary standards of behaviour and attitudes across the entire sixth form.

Improvements in Attendance

This term, we have also seen marked improvements in our whole school attendance, which is incredibly encouraging. The Eckington Way (Safe, Calm, Polite and Kind, Prepared and Ambitious) is having a tangible impact on our students' school experience and improvements in attendance. As always, we strongly encourage all families to prioritise good attendance, as we know that consistent attendance is key to educational achievement, as well as an important life skill.

Excellent Careers Fair

Recently, we also celebrated a truly amazing Careers Fair in which our sports hall was transformed into a vibrant marketplace for careers, with over 60 employment providers offering invaluable insights to our students from Year 7 to Year 13. It was fantastic to see so many of our students taking the opportunity to ask questions and explore potential future career paths.

Student Engagement in Eckington's Enrichment Programme

Our Eckington Enrichment programme continues to thrive, with students engaging in a wide range of lunch and after-school clubs. I am also delighted to share that the second cohort of Duke of Edinburgh students are being enrolled onto the course with the expedition planned for the summer term.
