
## Welcome Back – Spring Term

These results are a vital checkpoint and should be used to help tailor revision in preparation for GCSE and A Level examinations this summer. The most successful approach to revision is well known – little and often, focused on areas of improvement identified through mock exam and teacher feedback, rather than last-minute cramming. - Support all school policies and procedures and engage with the school (for example, attendance parents' evening)
- Provide a quiet and calm place for home-learning

- **We expect students to:**

- Always follow the Eckington Way (safe, calm, polite & kind, prepared and ambitious)
- Have excellent attitudes to learning in all lessons
- Have excellent behaviour and attendance

## Attendance Really Does Matter...

Finally, I cannot overstate the importance of excellent school attendance. Our target is **97%** as this gives students the best chance of academic and holistic success. **Put simply, whilst 90% would be an excellent exam result, it is a very concerning attendance figure** as it equates to 19 days (95 hours) of lost learning in a single year. Please refer to the attendance ladder (right) for further clarity.
